<p>Written by Thomas Jefferson</p>	<p>Separated church and state</p>
<p>Established religious freedom</p>	<p>The basis for the first amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which guarantees freedom of religion</p>

<p>Explained why the colonies should break away from England</p>	<p>Was adopted on July 4, 1776, by the Second Continental Congress</p>
